

Amerisource And Bergen Brunswick Receive Request For Additional Information From Federal Trade Commission

VALLEY FORGE, PA, and ORANGE, CA, May 07, 2001 - AmeriSource Health Corporation (NYSE:AAS) and Bergen Brunswick Corporation (NYSE: BBC) today announced that, as anticipated, they have received a request for additional information and documentary material from the Federal Trade Commission in connection with their previously announced plan to merge the two companies.

This "second request" extends the waiting period under the Hart-Scott-Rodino Antitrust Improvements Act of 1976 during which the FTC is permitted to review the transaction.

On March 19, 2001, AmeriSource and Bergen Brunswick announced that they had entered into a merger agreement to create a new company named AmeriSource-Bergen Corporation. Under the terms of the agreement, each share of Bergen Brunswick common stock will be converted into 0.37 shares of AmeriSource-Bergen common stock and each share of AmeriSource common stock will be converted into one share of AmeriSource-Bergen common stock.
